Responsibilities

Under the overall direction of the Chief, Supply Chain Management Section and the direct supervision of the Central Warehosue Unit supervisor, the incumbent will be responsible but not limited to the following duties:

- Conducts physical inspections and quality control of mission United Nations Property to ensure that all items are accounted for and in serviceable condition.
- Prepares and submits Receiving and Inspection (R&I) reports, discrepancy reports, and disposal reports for the Unit supervisor's approval.
- Identifies anomalies and/or discrepancies and the details thereof, or any other reason for rejection and records in Damage Discrepancy Reports (DDR), posted on the system and presented to the Central Warehosue supervisor and Procurement for immediate action.
- Reviews Goods' Receipts reports in UMOJA and R&I Reports in electronic inventory management system.
- Maintains on a daily basis accurate and auditable property records in electronic inventory management system for property control and accountability in conformance with administrative instructions, guidelines, manuals and SOPs.
- Updates all physical verification records and data entry in electronic inventory management system.
- Assists stakeholders in application of property management policies and procedures to meet organizational standards and goals set up in the DFS Directives, LSD Guidelines and mission's SOPs.
- Produces Business Object reports on monthly basis and when requested by supervisor.
- Assists in drafting statements of requirements for contracts and services for disposal.
- Assists in monitoring the execution of contracts for the disposal of property and supplies, including all types of waste material.
- Assists Self-Accounting Units (SAUs) in preparation of equipment write-offs and processing of write-off cases through relevant property survey boards.
- Interacts with other property management stakeholders and providers of services, in particular SAUs, Procurement Unit and Local Property Survey Boards, as appropriate.
- Assists in carrying out Board of Survey functions as and when required.
- Prepares statistical analysis and trend analysis on United Nations property.
- Performs other duties as required.

Competencies

Professionalism – Knowledge of inventory management or logistics support, particularly in field support operations basic methods and principles of warehouse management, skilled in the use of product manuals, catalogues microfiche and price lists. Knowledge of UN standard procedures and accounting principles will be an advantage.; Shows pride in work and in achievements; Demonstrates professional competence and mastery of subject matter; Is conscientious and efficient in meeting commitments, observing deadlines and achieving results; is motivated by professional rather than personal concerns; shows persistence when faced with difficult problems or challenges; remains calm in stressful situations. **Technological Awareness** – Keeps abreast of available technology; understands applicability and limitation of technology; actively seeks to apply technology to appropriate tasks. **Communication** – Speaks and writes clearly and effectively; listens to others, correctly interprets messages from others and responds appropriately; asks questions to clarify, and exhibits interest in having two-way communication; tailors language, tone, style and format to match audience; demonstrates openness in sharing information and keeping people informed. **Teamwork** – Works collaboratively with colleagues to achieve organizational goals; solicits input

by genuinely valuing others' ideas and expertise; is willing to learn from others; places team agenda before personal agenda; supports and acts in accordance with final group decision, even when such decisions may not entirely reflect own position; shares credit for team accomplishments and accepts joint responsibility for team shortcomings. **Planning & Organizing** — Develops clear goals that are consistent with agreed strategies. Education

High School certificate. Technical training in one of these areas: supply, inventory management or logistics support is an advantage. For this position, knowledge of Umoja / SAP is desirable.

Work Experience

At least five (05) years progressively responsible experience in supply, inventory management or logistics support, and warehouse procedures and practices. Experience in providing services within international peacekeeping or military operations is highly desirable. Knowledge of the UN rules, regulations and working practices pertaining to field missions is an advantage. Experience with the UN enterprise planning system (Umoja) is desirable.

Languages

Fluency in spoken and written English is required; working knowledge of spoken and written Arabic & Hebrew is desirable.

Other Skills

Valid National Driving License is required (Attach a copy with your application); Good computer skills; knowledge of inventory control systems is an advantage.

Assessment Method
